At 3:00 p.m., we are in for a treat - a panel of amazing women mystery writers, moderated by Maddie Margarita.







Maddie Margarita is the producer of Lit Up! Orange County, a monthly author event that has showcased the works of over eighty-five Southern California writers. She also writes and had several of her short stories featured in IT'S ALL IN THE STORY, an anthology edited by Doug Lyle, and is currently shopping her romantic suspense novel. She belongs to Sisters in Crime, OC Writers, and serves on the Board of the Southern California Writer's Association as Chief Talent Wrangler and Events Chair.

Panelists:

Anne Cleeland has a degree in English from UCLA as well as a law degree from Pepperdine University and is a member of the California State Bar. She worked as an attorney for many years before finally turning her interest to writing contemporary and historical mystery novels. She currently writes the new Scotland Yard mystery series with the first book being MURDER IN THRALL. She also writes historical fiction mysteries set in the Regency era. Anne is a member of the International Thriller Writers, The Historical Novel Society and Mystery Writers of America.

Linda O. Johnston was a transactional lawyer but always loved writing. She is currently writing three series in three different genres: mystery, paranormal romance and romantic suspense published by Midnight Ink and Berkley Prime Crime, respectively. Her latest mystery that recently came out is PICK & CHEWS. Linda is a member of Sisters in Crime, Mystery Writers of America, International Thriller Writers and Romance Writers of America.

Patricia Smiley was a volunteer and Specialist Reserve Office for the LAPD for fifteen years. She was trained in detective procedures, Homicide investigation, etc. and was selected as Reserve Office of the Year under Chief Bratton. She was a past president of the L.A. Sisters in Crime chapter and is currently writing a new series featuring LAPD Homicide Detective Davie Richards. PACIFIC HOMICIDE is the first in the series followed by OUTSIDE THE WIRE and THE SECOND GOODBYE which is debuting this December. Her short fiction has appeared in Ellery Queen Mystery Magazine and Two of the Deadliest, an anthology edited by Elizabeth George.

On Sunday, May 27, our guest speaker was Tod Goldberg. Goldberg is The New York Times bestselling author of more than a dozen books, including his new series,







Gangster Nation, Gangsterland (a finalist for the Hammett Prize), and The House of Secrets, the novel he co-authored with New York Times bestselling author Brad Meltzer. Goldberg's novel, Living Dead Girl was a finalist for the Los Angeles Times Book Prize, and his short story collection, Simplify, was a 2006 finalist for the SCIBA Award for Fiction and winner of the Other Voices Short Story Collection Prize. Goldberg holds an MFA and directs the Low Residency MFA Program in Creative Writing and Writing for the Performing Arts at the University of California, Riverside, Palm Desert. He lives in Indio, CA with his wife, the writer Wendy Duren. He discussed at fascinating length the background and circumstances that led him to write Gangsterland.
